

Admission to the Graduate Nursing Program is competitive. Class size is limited to accommodate space and faculty/student ratios. Applicants to the Graduate Nursing Program must provide the following items by the deadline date:

- Application to the School of Graduate Studies at Grambling State Univ.
- Application for admission to the graduate Nursing Program
- Baccalaureate degree in nursing from a program accredited by Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing
- A cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale for nursing degree courses.
- Official transcripts from all colleges and universities attended received by the School of Graduate Studies and the School of Nursing
- Submit official scores for the Graduate Record Examination (GRE). Scores must be within 5 years prior to the date of admission into the graduate program
- Completion of health assessment course taught in an accredited nursing program with a grade of "C" or higher
- Completion of statistics course with a grade of "C" or higher
- Minimum work experience as an RN for two
 (2) years
- Letters of recommendation from three professional/ academic references received by The School of Nursing and the School of Graduate Studies
- Completion of an admission interview with the School of Nursing's graduate faculty
- Graduate level writing course, NUR 500, or an acceptable substitute approved by faculty

The Graduate Nursing Program admits annually in the Fall Semester. Deadline for application to the School of Nursing is:

April 15th
