Candidates seeking program admission must fulfill the following criteria:
_ Must be admitted to the College of Educational, Professional and Graduate Studies
__ Must complete a Degree Program Application
__ Must have a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.50 (4.00 scale) at time of admission request
$\qquad$ Must have earned at least 36 semester hours (including all 100 and 200 level education courses)
$\qquad$ Must have evidence of passing the Praxis I Core Academic Skills for Educators Exam: Reading, 156; Writing, 162; Mathematics, 150 or Pre-Professional Skills Test (PPST): Reading, 176; Writing, 175; Mathematics, 175 OR an ACT composite score of 22 or a SAT combined verbal and math score of 1030.
__ Must complete a successful formal interview with the Portal II Committee
__ Must demonstrate competency in writing (submitted at least one week before the interview)
$\qquad$ Must submit a completed Professional Conduct Form
$\qquad$ Must complete Disposition Inventory \#2
$\qquad$ Must secure a Taskstream Account using Code\#BUFFNC
__ Must have proof of passing a criminal background check
$\qquad$ Must provide proof of membership in a Professional Teacher's
Organization that offers liability insurance

## Next Steps - Eligibility for Student Teaching (Clinical Practice)

- To become eligible to student teach, a candidate must meet all of the Clinical Practice requirements at the time of application and complete a total of 180 hours of observation and participation.
- ED 201 - Must have completed at least three to graduate.
