Candidates seeking program admission must fulfill the following criteria: Must be admitted to the College of Educational, Professional and Graduate Studies Must complete a Degree Program Application Must have a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.50 (4.00 scale) at time of admission request Must have earned at least 36 semester hours (including all 100 and 200 level education courses) Must have evidence of passing the Praxis I Core Academic Skills for Educators Exam: Reading, 156; Writing, 162; Mathematics, 150 or Pre-Professional Skills Test (PPST): Reading, 176; Writing, 175; Mathematics, 175 **OR** an ACT composite score of 22 or a SAT combined verbal and math score of 1030. Must complete a successful formal interview with the Portal II Committee Must demonstrate competency in writing (submitted at least one week before the interview) Must submit a completed Professional Conduct Form Must complete Disposition Inventory #2 Must secure a Taskstream Account using Code#BUFFNC Must have proof of passing a criminal background check Must provide proof of membership in a Professional Teacher's Organization that offers liability insurance

## Next Steps - Eligibility for Student Teaching (Clinical Practice)

- To become eligible to student teach, a candidate must meet all of the Clinical Practice requirements at the time of application and complete a total of 180 hours of observation and participation.
