# SCHOLARSHIP APPEALS

## I. PURPOSE/OBJECTIVE

The Appeals Policy was designed to allow students the opportunity to have their decision reconsidered and possibly regain eligibility for scholarships.

## **II. STATEMENT OF POLICIES**

- A. Students may submit a written appeal for consideration to the Student Financial Aid Office based upon special and/or unusual circumstances.
  - 1. Death of family member
  - 2. Documented illness and/or injury
  - 3. Unusual circumstances that caused the student to have a poor semester
  - 4. Incomplete/grade changes

#### III. PRESIDENTIAL SCHOLARSHIP

If the semester grade point average falls below the required GPA, the student may retain the award for the immediate succeeding fall or spring semester if his/her cumulative GPA is a 3.5 or above. If the student fails to make the required GPA that semester, then he/she will forfeit the award forever. If the student is not enrolled full time (at least 12hrs.); then the student is in violation and will forfeit the award.

## IV. ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIP

If the semester grade point average falls below the required GPA, the student may retain the award for the immediate succeeding fall or spring semester if his/her cumulative GPA is 3.0 or above. If the student fails to make the required GPA that semester, then he/she will forfeit the award forever. If the student is not enrolled full time (at least 12hrs.); then the student is in violation and will forfeit the award.

#### V. BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' SCHOLARSHIP

If the semester grade point average falls below the required GPA, the student may retain the award for the immediate succeeding fall or spring semester if his/her cumulative GPA is 3.0 or above. If the student fails to make the required GPA that semester, then he/she will forfeit the award forever. If the student is not enrolled full time (at least 12hrs.); then the student is in violation and will forfeit the award.
