Academic Attire

The robes and hoods worn by academics in commencements and convocations generally convey information about the degrees, the subjects in which degrees were earned, and the universities that conferred the degrees. The doctoral robe, which is most often black, is sometimes worn in the colors of the university that conferred the degree. Doctoral recipients from Harvard University wear a maroon robe, while those from Columbia University wear a light blue robe.

The doctoral robe is a full gown with two velvet panels down the front. It has long, bell shaped sleeves with three velvet stripes. The master's robe is generally not as full as the doctoral robe. It has open sleeves which usually require that a suit coat be worn under the robe. The bachelor's robe with its long, pointed sleeves is without distinction.

The doctoral hood offers information about the university that conferred the degree and the field in which the degree was earned. The colors found inside the hood identify the university that awarded the degree. The color found on the velvet border around the hood represents the subject in which the doctorate was earned.

The University Mace is usually carried by the University Marshal, Dr. Connie Walton, Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs. Today, the mace is being carried by Dr. Carolyn Marshall-Jackson, the Arlynne Lake Cheers Endowed Professor in Education, Associate Professor in the Department of Developmental and Higher Education Studies and Chair of the Institutional Review Board at Grambling State University. Dr. Marshall-Jackson was selected as an Honorary Marshal because of her outstanding accomplishments in teaching, research, and service. She earned the Bachelor of General Studies in Natural Sciences/Teacher Education from Northeast Louisiana University, the Master of Education in Administration and Supervision plus 30 and the Master of Science in Counseling-Clinical Mental Health from the University of Louisiana at Monroe as well as the Doctor of Education in Developmental Education from Grambling State University.


